Frequently asked questions

- My child has been in public school, will they be too far behind in a classical school environment? Our comprehensive application, testing, and interview process ensures that each accepted student is well-prepared to thrive in our rigorous academic environment, whether transitioning from homeschool, public school, or private school settings. The initial evaluation will help tailor the curriculum to suit your child's specific needs, ensuring that any gaps in knowledge are addressed effectively. In the classroom, teachers can implement differentiated instruction strategies. This means that while a class may be engaged in a particular topic, students can be given different assignments or learning activities based on their current understanding whenever necessary.
- I've heard that classical education can be very difficult for children, especially if they start at a classical school in late elementary. Is that true?

We wholeheartedly disagree! In kindergarten through 5th grade, children are in the "Grammar Stage" of a classical education. During this stage, their young minds are like sponges, uniquely suited for absorbing and memorizing foundational knowledge. Logic and rhetoric are introduced later, as these stages build upon the solid groundwork laid in the Grammar Stage. Elementary students engage in learning through enjoyable and effective methods such as songs, chants, and poems, making education both interactive and integrative. Your child will thrive in this fun and engaging approach to building a strong academic foundation!

We're concerned about the cost, especially because we have multiple children. Do you offer discounts to families?

We know that for many families it is a challenge to afford a high-quality Christian education. We've tried to keep our tuition costs affordable and do have payment plans. In addition, we offer a 10% discount to families who enroll more than one child. Another excellent option in North Carolina is the Opportunity Scholarship Program. This program provides financial assistance to families to help cover tuition costs for children attending qualified non-public schools, including many classical Christian schools. Eligible families may receive funding based on their financial circumstances, which can significantly reduce the burden of tuition.
